Today we will celebrate the Asperges (Sprinkling with Holy Water) at all Masses.

<u>Happy New Year:</u> Today marks the start of the Season of Advent and the beginning of a New Church Year. Sunday readings come from Year C and we will listen to St Luke's Gospel in the new translation. There will be a new volume of the Parish Mass book.

The first part of Advent looks forward to the Second Coming of Christ while the second part prepares us for the coming of Christ at Christmas and the celebration of the Incarnation. It is a penitential season and so the colour is purple. But it is not as solemn as Lent. Purple is the colour of hope and during this time we listen to the prophets as they hope for the coming of the Messiah. The readings and the plainchant for this season are simple and beautiful. We do not use the Gloria but at 10.30 Mass will sing the Kyrie and Lamb of God.

Advent Wreath: On the First Sunday of Advent we will bless the Advent Wreath with its five candles: three purple, one pink and one white. The pink is for Gaudete Sunday [3rd Sunday] and the white candle is lit at Christmas for Christ. Each week we will ask a child to light the candle of that Sunday and then we will sing our Candle Song. The Advent Wreath with its greenery is a symbol of our Advent hope and our countdown to Christmas.

The Jesse Tree is a bare branch in a pot which we decorate with symbols each week. Symbols are people and events from our Salvation History. Children colour in these symbols during their own Liturgy in the hall and bring them up at the Preparation of the Gifts (as in previous years). The Jesse Tree is depicted in medieval art as the ancestry tree of Jesus. It is named after Jesse, (not the cowboy) the father of King David. Jesse is usually show asleep on the ground and tree growing from his loins. On this tree in stained glass windows you can see the prophets as well as Mary and then Jesus. Some trees, like ours, go back to Adam and Eve. It is a good way of learning Bible stories and connecting them together in the history of our Salvation. This week's symbols are: Adam & Eve, Noah and Abraham & Sarah.

Advent "Walk with Me" booklets are available in the porch to buy at £1.00 each, together with the Children's Advent Calendar at 30p each. Please put money in the wall box labelled "cards etc." Thank you.

<u>Beware of Scammers – Message from Diocese ICT Department</u>: We'd like to bring to your attention a concerning rise in scam emails targeting our parishioners. These emails impersonate the parish priest, often using a similar email name and masking the real email address. They typically request the recipient to purchase Amazon or other gift cards as gifts for the priest.

Unfortunately, we have received reports of parishioners falling victim to these scams, with some individuals losing up to £600 to the fraudsters.

- Never to purchase gift cards as gifts for the parish priest, based on an email request, unless they have verified the request directly in person or through a trusted means.
- To double-check any suspicious email by directly contacting the parish office.
- To avoid sharing personal or financial information in response to unsolicited emails.

If you or your parishioners encounter these emails, please encourage them to report them as spam and inform the parish office immediately.
