Called to Bear Fruit: Last week we listened to a Pastoral letter from Archbishop John and gave out the booklets: "Called to Bear fruit". I hope you took a copy and more importantly, read it at home. The Archbishop wants to get your ideas on how we can revitalise our Diocese and parish. There are six themes for discussion and prayer and the idea is that parishioners will form small discussion groups for between 4 to 7 people to look at these. The booklet gives the format for discussion. You can meet in your homes or in the church or hall depending on availability. You can meet in the morning, afternoon or evening. Each group needs a leader and someone to take notes. The notes can be fed back to the "Called to Bear Fruit Team".
