<u>We really need your help at St John Vianney</u>: Could you please consider offering to help when you're next at Mass? We need Welcomers, someone to open the Repository, First Aiders and Fire Marshals. See what is required below:

<u>Welcomers at 8.30, 10.30 and 5.30pm Masses</u>; This involves arriving early to handout missals and hymn books to parishioners. Organising people to take the collection (usually 4 is required) and bring up the Offertory gifts. After Mass, one person to put Offertory money into the safe whilst others retrieve books as parishioners leave. Turn out lights and lock church.

<u>Repository:</u> Our shop is usually open at 8.30am and 10.30am Mass on Sundays. We need help in opening the shop before Mass (usually 20 minutes beforehand) and manning the shop after Mass as parishioners leave. All items are priced.

<u>First Aiders</u> are needed at each Mass. Training will be given to you. It is essential to have trained First Aiders on site when Mass is taking place.

<u>Fire Marshals:</u> This role involves highlighting an emergency, evacuating parishioners in a calm and orderly manner, contacting the fire brigade if deemed necessary etc. Onsite training will be given.

With Lent around the corner, maybe now is the time to consider becoming move involved in parish life and ensuring that all our Health & Safety needs are met.
