OCTOBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY

Today is Prisoners' Sunday: This is a day of National Prayer for Prisoners, their families and children. In this jubilee year, we have the opportunity to remember those impacted by the criminal justice system. Pope Francis started this year of hope by opening five jubilee doors. The second was opened at Rebibbia Prison in Rome, where Pope Francis reminded us that we each can be prisoners in our own way. He spoke to the prisoners about the need to have hope in their hearts and not leave them closed. Throughout Pope Francis' papacy, he reminded us of God's love and mercy, and he showed this by visiting those in Rebibbia Prison and washing the feet of prisoners. This Prisoners' Sunday, we remember this legacy of Pope Francis, and his reminder of Jesus's words, "I was in prison, and you came to visit me".

Next Sunday, there is a Second Collection for Missio: Missio is the Church's official organ for the support of foreign missions. The collection taken on World Mission Sunday goes in its entirety to support churches, hospitals, schools and vocations in countries where the Church is new, young or poor. Missio works through local bishops, churches and missionary congregations to ensure that resources are distributed equitably and justly on the basis of need. The money goes directly from England and Wales to the bishops in the mission territories: local church directly helping local church.
