Second Sunday of Advent: Today we celebrate the Asperges or Sprinkling with Holy Water at all Masses. This is a reminder of our baptism and has a penitential aspect too. This Sunday and next we focus on John the Baptist who was sent by God to prepare the way for the Messiah and baptised Jesus in the Jordan. He straddles these two Sundays of Advent like a Colossus. John has a foot in the Old Testament

and the New. He is both prophet and witness to Christ. He is the voice

crying in the wilderness spoken of by Isaiah.

Advent Wreath: Today we will light our second purple candle. Our wreath has fives candles: three purple, one pink and one white. The pink is for Gaudete Sunday (3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday) and the white candle is lit at Christmas for Christ. Each week we will ask a child to light the candle of that Sunday and then we will sing our Candle Song. The Advent Wreath with its greenery is a symbol of our Advent hope and our countdown to Christmas.

<u>Donations of Holly:</u> Now is the time to bring in your donations of holly to enable us to decorate the church. Please put in a black bag and leave in the room where the servers get ready. Thank you.

<u>Today</u> is the deadline for receiving First Holy Communion and Confirmation registration forms. Fr Michael and Fr Luke will meet with Confirmation Candidates after 10.30 Mass in the hall to have a brief chat with them

<u>Next Sunday</u> is Rejoicing Sunday when we use rose vestments and light the pink candle on the Advent wreath. We are rejoicing that the Lord is near and for those of you having a penitential Advent, you can relax a little.

<u>This Wednesday</u> we welcome the Upper Juniors from St Thomas More School for their Carol Services at 5pm and 6pm. Parishioners are welcome to attend.

Advent "Walk with Me" booklets are available in the porch to buy at £1.00 each, together with the Children's Advent Calendar at 30p each. Please put money in the wall box labelled "cards etc." Thank you.

<u>Decorating for Christmas:</u> We will be decorating the church and tree on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> December at 10.00am. If you can spare some time, please do come along and join the festivities as we prepare the Way for Our Lord.

<u>Volunteering at Christmas:</u> Our lists are on the noticeboard in the porch for you to sign up as a Welcomer, Reader, EM and Altar Server for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. We are also looking for people to read the poems at our 9.30pm Carol Concert. We encourage you to put your name down. Thank you in advance.

The Jesse Tree is a bare branch in a pot which we decorate with symbols each week. Symbols are people and events from our Salvation History. Children colour in these symbols during their own Liturgy in the hall and bring them up at the Preparation of the Gifts (as in previous years). The Jesse Tree is depicted in medieval art as the ancestry tree of Jesus. It is named after Jesse, (not the cowboy) the father of King David. Jesse is usually shown asleep on the ground and tree growing from his loins. On this tree in stained glass windows, you can see the prophets as well as Mary and then Jesus. Some trees, like ours, go back to Adam and Eve. It is a good way of learning Bible stories and connecting them together in the history of our Salvation. This week's symbols are: Moses and the Ten Commandments, Ruth (the grandmother of Jesse) and the prophet Samuel.

<u>Crib Donations:</u> This year, our Crib donations will be going to The Bethlehem Care and Hospice Trust. This Trust was established following a request from Bethlehem Christians for help in establishing a hospice. Bethlehem has the highest reported number of cancer cases in the Occupied Palestinian Territories (OPT) and cancer is the second highest contributor to Bethlehem deaths, with over 150% rise between 2000 and 2020. This is a registered charity in the UK and is also a registered NGO in Palestine. It is the only licensed palliative care provider in the OPT.

In Bethlehem, it has a strong infrastructure; an operations board with supporting financial and clinical governance committees. Last year The Bethlehem Care and Hospice Trust nurses made over 2,000 home visits, providing end-of-life care and family support for 85 patients. There are a great many more people in need, whom the charity cannot reach without vital donations to support its ongoing work. The charity urgently needs support to enable sufferers to end their days pain free and with dignity.
