Ken's Funeral Mass is this Wednesday (28th) at 10.15am here, followed by Eltham Crematorium at 11.45am.

Today is the last Sunday our Crib will be on display. It's not too late to donate to The Bethlehem Care and Hospice Trust, which is the charity we've been supporting. Thank you for your kind donations.

Next Sunday is Racial Justice Day and there will be a second collection. The money raised supports the work of the Catholic Church to promote racial justice in our schools, parishes and in wider society. Archbishop John Wilson is saying Mass at 10.00am in St George's Cathedral. Racial Justice Sunday is a time for the Church to pray, reflect and take action against racism, while celebrating the diversity of our Archdiocese. Everyone is invited to take part, and those who wish may wear national or cultural dress as a sign of unity and pride. If you would like, please gather outside the cathedral at 9.45am to join the procession of national flags. After Mass, all are welcome to gather in Amigo Hall for refreshments – a chance to meet one another, share experiences and continue the conversation about faith and inclusion. St John Vianney Church will be hosting the "International Exhibition of The Eucharistic Miracles of the World" designed and created by Saint Carlo Acutis from 30th January to 15th February (inclusive). Saint Carlo Acutis (3rd May 1991-12th October 2006) was an English-born Italian Catholic teenager known for his devotion to the Eucharist and his use of digital media to promote Catholic devotion. Born in London and raised in Milan, he developed an early interest in computers and video games, teaching himself programming and web design and assisting his parish and school with digital projects. Active in parish life, he served as a catechist and helped inspire several people to convert to Catholicism. He later created a website documenting Eucharistic miracles and Marian apparitions. He was diagnosed with acute promyelocytic leukaemia and died at the age of fifteen. Since his death, his relics have been displayed in Assisi and his exhibitions on Eucharistic miracles have travelled worldwide. In 2020, he was beatified by the Catholic Church after its recognition of a 2013 miracle in Campo Grande, capital of a Brazilian state attributed to his intercession, and a second miracle in Italy was attributed in 2024. Acutis was canonised as a saint on 7th September 2025, alongside Pier Giorgio Frassati. Acutis has been referred to as the "patron saint of the Internet", "God's Influencer" and the "first millennial saint". **Please do take time to come and see this exhibition. Either come early to Mass or stay afterwards and take time looking at the miraculous works.**
